Secondary distribution boxes must meet strict material, installation, and safety standards, including proper enclosure selection, grounding, spacing, and compliance with national and industry regulations.

Material and Structural Requirements

Secondary distribution boxes are typically made from steel plates or insulating materials, with wooden enclosures generally not recommended. The steel thickness should meet minimum standards: 1.5mm for general enclosures, 2.0mm for cabinet doors and panels, and 3.0mm for back panels. The structure must be firm, with sturdy guide rails and welded mounting lugs for non-floor-standing boxes to ensure stability and safety during operation .

Installation and Positioning

- Height from ground: Fixed boxes should be installed 1.3–1.5m above ground, while mobile boxes should be 0.6–1.5m above ground .
- Alignment: Boxes must be installed straight and firmly, avoiding tilting or inversion.
- Spacing: The distance between a distribution box and a switch box should not exceed 30m, and the horizontal distance between a switch box and fixed electrical equipment should not exceed 3m .
- Environmental considerations: Install in well-ventilated areas, away from flammable gas sources, high humidity, high temperature, or corrosive environments .
