A switch port in trunk mode carries traffic for multiple VLANs, tagging each frame with VLAN information to allow communication across switches or devices supporting multiple VLANs.

What Trunk Mode Means

When a switch's optical port is in trunk mode, it is configured to transport traffic for multiple VLANs simultaneously. Each Ethernet frame sent through the port is tagged with a VLAN identifier (except for the native VLAN, which may remain untagged) so that the receiving device can distinguish which VLAN the traffic belongs to. Trunk ports are typically used for switch-to-switch connections or switch-to-router links where multiple VLANs need to traverse a single physical link.

Key Characteristics

- **VLAN Tagging:** Frames are tagged using IEEE 802.1Q encapsulation, which is the industry standard for VLAN trunking.
- **Multiple VLANs:** By default, a trunk port allows all VLANs (1-4094), but you can restrict the allowed VLANs to control traffic flow.
- **Operational Behavior:** Only another trunk port can interpret the tagged frames correctly. If a trunk port is connected to an access port, traffic may be dropped because the access port does not understand VLAN tags.
- **Dynamic Trunking Protocol (DTP):** Cisco switches can negotiate trunking automatically using DTP, but manual configuration is often preferred for stability.
