

Vertical Cable Tray Installation Techniques



Summary of Content

Vertical cable trays must be installed with proper material selection, secure support, correct spacing, and compliance with electrical and fire safety standards to ensure safe and reliable operation.

Material Selection and Design

Vertical cable trays are typically made from cold-rolled steel, galvanized steel, or aluminum alloy, with surface treatments like hot-dip galvanizing or electrostatic spraying to meet corrosion resistance standards (GB/T 13912) and fire resistance (GB 8624 Class B1) requirements. Tray units include the tray, cover, and connectors, with a load-bearing capacity of at least 200 kg/m. Design considerations include avoiding interference with ventilation ducts, water pipes, and maintaining a minimum clearance of 300 mm from other services.

Support and Mounting

The support system is critical for vertical cable trays. Common methods include cantilever wall brackets for vertical runs and trapeze hangers for suspended sections. Supports must be installed according to the manufacturer's load capacity charts, ensuring the tray can safely carry the anticipated cable weight. When multiple trays are installed, spacing between power and weak-current trays should exceed 150 mm, and isolation plates are required at crossings.
