

What cable tray should emergency cables be run in



Summary of Content

Emergency cables should be run in dedicated, properly rated cable trays such as ladder or ventilated trough trays, using tray-rated (TC or MI) cables in compliance with NEC Article 392.

Recommended Tray Types

Ladder trays are the most common choice for emergency power and critical circuits because they provide excellent ventilation, reducing heat buildup and maintaining ampacity for high-current cables. The open rung design allows easy installation, inspection, and maintenance, which is crucial for emergency systems. Ventilated trough trays can also be used, especially for smaller control or signal cables associated with emergency systems. They provide continuous support and moderate ventilation, preventing sagging of smaller cables. Solid-bottom trays are generally reserved for environments where cables need protection from debris, moisture, or chemical exposure, but they reduce heat dissipation and may require ampacity derating.

Cable Types

Emergency circuits must use tray-rated cables, typically Type TC (Tray Cable) or MI (Mineral-Insulated) cables, which are UL-listed and suitable for fire-resistance and mechanical protection. These cables are designed to withstand exposure in open trays and maintain integrity under emergency conditions. MI cables are particularly suitable for critical emergency services due to their two-hour fire rating.
