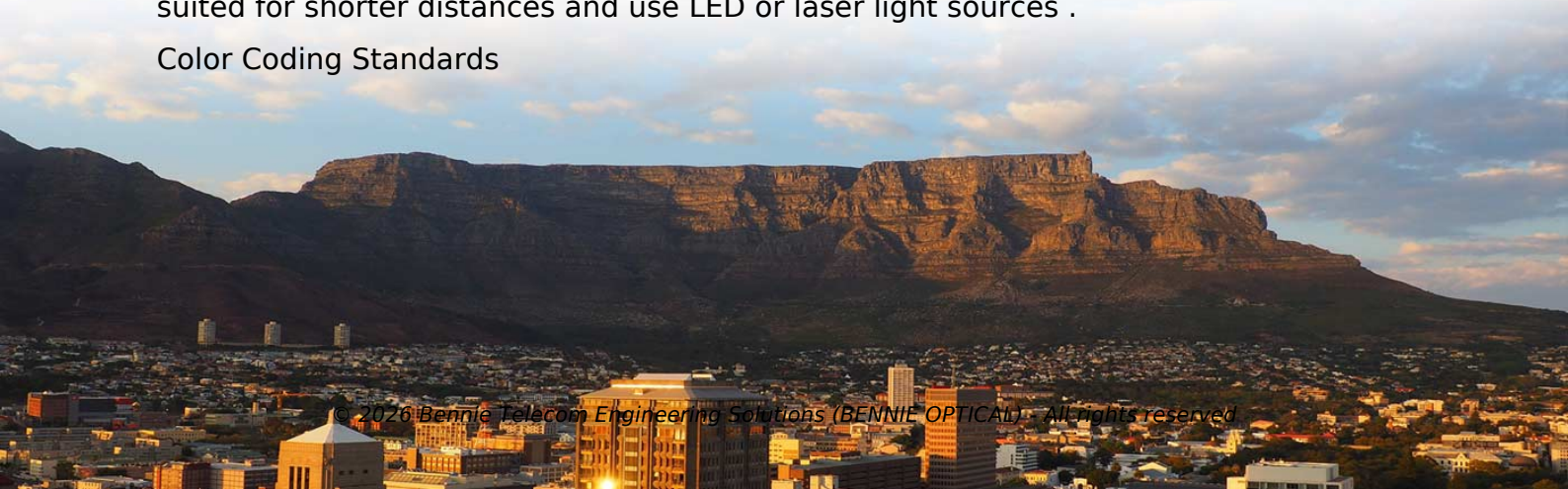
What Yellow Fiber Means

In fiber optic color coding, a yellow outer jacket universally signifies single-mode fiber (OS1 or OS2), which has a 9µm core and is optimized for long-distance communication using laser light sources (such as 1310 nm or 1550 nm wavelengths) for high-speed networks. Single-mode fibers are ideal for telecom backbones, ISP networks, and long-haul data transmission, capable of covering tens of kilometers without significant signal loss.

Single-Mode vs Multimode

- Single-mode fiber (yellow): Uses a single light path, minimizing modal dispersion, and supports very high bandwidth over long distances. OS1 is typically used indoors with tight-buffered cabling, while OS2 is used outdoors or in loose-tube designs.
- Multimode fiber: Uses multiple light paths (modes) and is usually color-coded aqua, orange, or violet depending on the OM type (OM1-OM5). Multimode fibers are better suited for shorter distances and use LED or laser light sources.
