The box also provides mechanical protection and can resist moisture, dust, UV exposure, and temperature fluctuations, especially in outdoor models .

Types of Fiber Optic Terminal Boxes

- Wall-mounted FTBs: Compact boxes for indoor use in homes, offices, or small data closets, suitable for smaller-scale deployments .
- Rack-mounted FTBs: Larger boxes installed in equipment racks, ideal for data centers or telecom facilities with high port density .
