

What is the best height for laying cable trays

Cable trays should be installed at a minimum height of 1.8 meters for vertical runs and 2.5 meters for horizontal runs from the ground, with protective measures if these heights cannot be met.

- Routing and Safety: Cable trays should not obstruct pedestrian pathways or maintenance areas, and excessive height should be avoided to reduce construction difficulty .
