

# What is the normal temperature for a household electrical distribution box



## Overview

The standard baseline used across most electrical codes and equipment ratings is 30°C (86°F). When the surrounding air exceeds that number, wires carry less current safely, components fail sooner, and insulation breaks down faster. Due to electrical resistance, some energy is naturally converted into heat during operation, meaning a slight warmth is a common characteristic of normal operation. Homeowners must distinguish this harmless operational warmth from excessive, dangerous heat, which signals a serious fault requiring. Ambient temperature in electrical work is the temperature of the air surrounding a conductor, component, or piece of equipment after it's been installed and is operating. When the surrounding air exceeds. But the temperature of a residential circuit breaker in a panel should not exceed about 140° F; or, on hot days, it's better to only call it out when the temperature difference between the breaker and surrounding surface exceeds 50° F. If it gets too hot, parts can stop working or even catch fire. Once it reaches 140°F (60°C), it should shut off automatically.
