Structure of a Pigtail Fiber

A fiber optic pigtail consists of a short length of optical fiber with a factory-terminated connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other end, usually ranging from 0.5m to 5m in length . The bare fiber is designed to be fusion-spliced to a larger fiber optic cable in the field. Because the fiber itself is extremely fragile, the pigtail includes internal reinforcement to prevent breakage during handling and installation .

Strength Members

The internal thread or strength member is commonly made of aramid fibers (e.g., Kevlar), which provide high tensile strength while remaining lightweight . In some designs, fiber-reinforced plastic (FRP) rods or steel threads may also be used, especially in armored or outdoor pigtails, to enhance durability and resistance to pulling forces . These materials absorb mechanical stress, protect against micro-bending, and ensure the optical signal remains intact during installation and operation.
