According to the TIA-598-C standard, a yellow jacket universally signifies single-mode fiber, which has a 9 $\mu$ m core and is optimized for long-distance communication using laser light sources. Single-mode fibers are typically used in telecom backbones, ISP networks, and other high-speed, long-range applications.

### Single-Mode Fiber Types

- OS1: Indoor, tight-buffered cabling, suitable for controlled environments.
- OS2: Outdoor or loose-tube designs, built for long-distance transmission in harsher conditions. Both types share the yellow color coding for easy identification, ensuring technicians can distinguish them from multimode fibers, which use colors like aqua (OM3/OM4) or lime (OM5).
