Capacity and Quota

Fiber distribution boxes (FDBs) are designed to terminate, splice, and distribute optical fibers in FTTH and PON networks. The quota or capacity of an FDB is generally defined by the number of fiber ports it can accommodate. Standard configurations range from 8 to 96 ports, depending on the network requirements and deployment layer . To ensure scalability and avoid early replacement, it is recommended to reserve 20–30% of the box's capacity for future growth. For example, a 48-port box should initially use no more than 34–38 ports, leaving room for additional fibers as subscriber demand increases .

Factors Affecting Quota

- **Deployment Layer:** Distribution-level boxes connecting feeder cables to subscriber branches often require higher port counts, while subscriber-side boxes near end-user premises may need fewer ports .
- **Splice and Slack Management:** Boxes must provide adequate space for splice trays and slack storage to maintain fiber integrity and minimize signal loss .
- **Environmental Protection:** Outdoor boxes with IP ratings (e.g., IP65–IP68) may have slightly different internal layouts, affecting usable port capacity .
